

Wood effect and stone effect paint

The most recent trend of **interior design** is to use paints that create particular effects, for example paints **stone effect** or paints **wood effect**, to give environments a new and more refined touch.

Both these effects can make a space more rustic, but, if used well and in the right dose, they also adapt well to contemporary environments with their beautiful contrast.

The use of stone and wood effect paints can help in creating a **makeover** a bit tired and dated environments without having to face a heavy and long renovation.

For example, they can be used for **floors**, for one **wall** stone effect, in contrast to the others, for some **furnishings**, such as the support surface of a washbasin or the top of a worktop.

The material on which these paints are applied, in fact, can be of various kinds, even the wood itself, although depending on the type of **support** then you need to understand what kind of primer to apply before the actual painting.

Furthermore, the type of product will also change depending on the substrate, as for wood, iron or plastic, for example, it is necessary to use paints based on **acrylic resins**.

Advantages of special effect paints

This type of paint offers several advantages, including the fact that they are produced **washable**, **water-repellent** and little **thick**, therefore, even if applied on existing floors, for example, they do not create problematic thicknesses for external frames and internal doors, as would otherwise be the case with a floor glued on the existing one.

In addition, these are paints and varnishes that can be **customized** in various ways, so much so that each finish can be said to be unique and **unrepeatable**.

An example of this are the finishes proposed by the company [Resin Srl](#) with headquarters in Gussago in the province of Brescia. Among the projects of this company there is **Resin 3D Line**, thanks to which it produces tailor-made design items without limits of shape, color and texture, like those seen in these stone effect cubes.



Another advantage of stone effect and wood effect paints is their employability on surfaces that otherwise could not be coated with heavy materials such as marble or stone slabs. For example, among these are the walls in **drywall** and walls with thermal coat.
